



An Impact Assessment of Stakeholder Engagement Interventions in Ugandan Oil Extractives

Business-Community Synergies (BCS), Maendeleo ya Jamii (MYJ) and Florida State University (FSU), are pleased to announce a new project: *An Impact Assessment of Stakeholder Engagement Interventions in Ugandan Oil Extractives*. The purpose of the project is to assess the added value of multi-stakeholder engagement for communities in the Lake Albert region.

Among the unique features of the study:

- Measuring transparency and accountability outcomes from community engagement with oil operators (Tullow, CNOOC, Total) and with local and regional government authorities in the Lake Albert region.
- Using mixed methods, qualitative and quantitative, in assessing impact.
- Measuring the impact of the study on key stakeholders.

All data from the study will be publicly available beginning with the baseline survey analysis in 2016. A full report will be available in early 2018.
